I. INTERNSHIP COORDINATOR AGREES TO:

- 1. Screen student-learner applications. Place or withdraw student interns as appropriate.

- 3. Administer the program, providing necessary forms and maintaining records on file.
- 4. Act as liaison between all parties, ensuring that policies and procedures are adhered to.
- 5. Develop the training plan in collaboration with the work site, CTE teacher and mentor.
- 6. Ensure that the internship experience supports CTE curriculum objectives.
- 7. Provide related instructional support and mentor evaluation tool(s).
- 8. Ensure grades are reflected in CTE program.
- 9. Notify the training site in advance if the status of the student-learner changes (when possible).
- 10. Discuss the student-learner's progress with the mentor and observe the student at the training site.
- 11. Coach the student about his or her progress during the internship.

II. MENTOR AGREES TO:

- 1. Provide a safe working environment in accordance with Federal and State labor laws.
- 2. Inform student of company rules and/or regulations as appropriate.
- Provide general instruction for all duties, tasks and responsibilities to be performed by the student.
- 4. Give the student progressive work activities consistent with the internship objectives, where possible.
- 5. Notify the Coordinator if the assignment or schedule is to be altered, and/or regarding concerns.
- 6. Provide direct supervision of the intern's work, sharing feedback on strengths/areas to improve.
- 7. Complete and return an evaluation of the student intern's overall progress on the form provided.
- 8. Verify the student's attendance on the internship site by signing the time sheet.
- 9. Honor school attendance policy, that students are not required to report during school vacation days, and that students absent from school may <u>not</u> participate in their internship that day.
- 10. Assure that the student intern's presence cannot result in the displacement of an employee.
- 11. Understand that the student is not entitled to wages or other compensation during the internship.
- 12. Verify/ensure that the student intern is covered under their Worker's Compensation Insurance policy.
- 13. Comply with applicable laws and regulations to safeguard, maintain confidentiality, and prohibit the redisclosure without proper authorization of all protected student information received.

III. STUDENT INTERN RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Provide own transportation to/from the internship, and commit to the schedule agreed upon without absence. Also to be in regular attendance at all BOCES and home school classes during internship.
- 2. Demonstrate a conscientious attitude, honesty, punctuality, cooperation, courtesy, and willing to learn.
- 3. Demonstrate appropriate dress or behavior in compliance with all policies and procedures required by the organization, school district or BOCES (i.e. "Student code of conduct").
- 4. Follow all instructions and perform the necessary tasks as given by the internship site supervisor.
- 5. Report to the Coordinator immediately when problems arise affecting his/her internship status.
- 6. Complete and submit all class work and assignments in a timely manner during the internship.
- 7. Maintain all obligations to his/her home school and the BOCES during the internship.
- 8. DO NOT report to the training site on days absent from school.
- 9. Notify the CTE teacher and internship supervisor on days absent or late (1-2 hours before start time).
- 10. Complete the self-evaluation and review mentor evaluation with CTE teacher or Coordinator.

IV. PARENT OR GUARDIAN RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Support the student in carrying out his/her commitment, schedule and transportation to/from the site.
- 2. Contact the Coordinator or teacher, when problems or questions arise concerning the internship.
- 3. Allow for the student intern's assigned school counselor to share relevant school records that would be helpful in assisting the student at the internship site, according to the "Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)".
- 4. Agree to hold the BOCES, home school district, and/or internship site harmless for accidents or injuries sustained as a result of driving to the internship or as a result of training on the site.
- 5. Provide health, accident, and automobile insurance for the student (if the student is driving).

Re: Proposal for GASB 45 Actuarial Services

Dear Dave:

This letter details the services and fees to perform GASB 45 actuarial services for 2016 for the retiree welfare plan sponsored by the City of Rome (the "City").

UNDERSTANDING OF SERVICES

The City sponsors a retiree welfare plan that provides postretirement medical, hospitalization, dental, vision, and life insurance benefits to eligible retirees. The City has multiple divisions, with different eligibility requirements and different benefits. The City requires costs to be broken out by each division. The Plan covers approximately 300 full-time active employees and 350 retirees.

The City needs an actuarial valuation of the retiree welfare plan in accordance with GASB 45.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

We will perform an actuarial valuation of the City's postemployment benefits based on participant data and premiums and claims information provided by the City and the City's benefits broker or TPA. We will review the assumptions used in the previous valuation and make recommendations if any of the assumptions should be considered for change.

Our report will detail the actuarial liabilities and costs, source data, plan provisions, actuarial methods and assumptions, the pay-as-you-go cost and the Annual Required Contribution for 2016, and will contain all the 2015 disclosure information required under GASB 45 as well as a 25-year projection of employer cash (pay-as-you-go) costs. Additionally, the valuation will contain the 2016 financial statement items and, other than adjustment by the City for actual 2016 payroll and postretirement welfare cash payments, will contain all the information the City will need for 2016 GASB 45 compliance.



FEES AND TIMING

Our charge to complete the actuarial valuation report, to review the report with the City, and consult with the City's auditor's to provide the necessary information to complete the City's financial statement audit will be based on our time charges using the hourly rates below, and is guaranteed not to exceed \$6,750.

Our fees quoted are contingent on the work remaining in the normal scope of the assignment, as it exists at the present time. If there is a significant expansion of the services required of us, such as analyzing the cost impact of changing the eligibility requirements, changing the level of benefits provided, changing the retiree contributions, etc., we reserve the right to adjust the fee cap, but the adjustment would be mutually agreed upon in advance. Projects outside of the scope of services stated above will be billed based on time and expense using the hourly rates below or a fixed-fee can be quoted if project parameters are clearly defined.
