A State of Emergency was declared in the City of Rome on March 16, 2020, due to the threat to the health and safety of the residents of the City of Rome from the COVID-19 pandemic. Ongoing response to this public health emergency necessitates the extension of the Declaration.

This State of Emergency will remain in effect until rescinded by a subsequent order.

As the Mayor of the City of Rome, I, Jacqueline M. Izzo, exercise the authority given me under Section 24 of the New York State Executive Law, do hereby extend the state of emergency in the City of Rome declared on March 16, 2020 in order to preserve the public safety and hereby render all required and available assistance vital to the security, well-being and health of the citizens of the City of Rome.

I hereby direct all departments and agencies of the City of Rome to continue to take whatever steps necessary to protect life and property, public infrastructure and provide such assistance deemed necessary.
