

POWERS, DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS OF COMMISSIONER OF DEEDS

A Commissioner of Deeds has the following powers:

- Administer Oaths within the territorial limits of the City of Rome.
(Executive Law, Section 142, subdivision 2)
- Take acknowledgment or proof of the execution of a written instrument to be read in evidence or recorded in the State *(not including bills of exchange, promissory notes, or wills)*.
(Executive Law, Section 142, Subdivision 1)
- Take the acknowledgment or proof, within the territorial limits of the City of Rome, of a conveyance of real property located within the State of New York.
(Real Property Law, Section 299, subdivision 4)

DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS:

- One who is guilty of malfeasance or fraudulent practice in the execution of the duties of Commissioner of Deeds is liable for damage to the person injured.
(Real Property Law, Section 330)
- A Commissioner of Deeds, who, in the performance of his/her duties, shall practice any fraud or deceit, is guilty of a misdemeanor.
(Executive Law, Section 135-a, subdivision 2)

FEES:

- A fee for the taking of a proof or acknowledgment of up to \$1.00 may be charged by the Commissioner of Deeds.
(Executive Law, Section 143)

(Executive Law, Section 139, subdivision 3)
