WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of Rome, Oneida County, New York (the "City") is considering undertaking a lead service line inventory within the City's established water system, in connection with the City's lead service line replacement program, as described in Local Finance Law Section 11(a)(109) (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law, as amended (the "SEQR Act") and the regulations adopted pursuant thereto by the Department of Environmental Conservation of the State of New York, being 6 NYCRR Part 617, as amended (the "Regulations"), the Common Council desires to comply with the SEQR Act and the Regulations with respect to the Project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROME, NEW YORK AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Project constitutes a "Type II Action" under the following Sections of the Regulations:

Section 617.5(c)(24) – Information collection including basic data collection and research, water quality and pollution studies, traffic counts, engineering studies, surveys, subsurface investigations and soils studies that do not commit the City to undertake, fund or approve any Type I or Unlisted action.

Section 617.5(c)(27) – Conducting concurrent environmental, engineering, economic, feasibility and other studies and preliminary planning and budgetary processes necessary to the formulation of a proposal for action, provided those activities do not commit the City to commence, engage in or approve such action.

2. No further action under the SEQR Act and the Regulations is required.

3. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor of the City of Rome is hereby authorized to submit the 2026 Community Development Block Grant Program Annual Action Plan and any and all necessary documents, to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, in order to receive the City of Rome’s 2026 Community Development Block Grant Entitlement, pursuant to the attached Annual Action Plan Summary that is made part of this Resolution; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all funds received under the Community Development Block Grant Program shall be administered by the City of Rome’s Department of Community & Economic Development, pursuant to the Housing and Community Act of 1974, 1980, 1983 and 1988, as amended.

2026 Annual Action Plan Summary
Community Development Block Grant

The City of Rome will receive an estimated \$1,000,000 in Entitlement Funding (EN) from the U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) for the 2026 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program year; the primary objective of the CDBG Program is the development of viable urban communities, by providing decent housing, a suitable living environment, and expanding economic opportunities, principally for persons of low to moderate income.

The City of Rome determines its spending priorities each year by reviewing the Consolidated Plan and conducting public outreach efforts through public meetings/hearings and surveys, consultation with local organizations, and its Community Development Advisory Committee (CDAC).

This year, the City of Rome will be committing the estimated \$ 1,000,000.00 to the following categories:

<u>Project Level</u>	<u>2026 Proposed Allocation</u>
• Real Property Improvements	\$100,000.00 or 10%
• Public Facility Improvements	\$370,000.00 or 37%
• Economic Development	\$230,000.00 or 23%
• Public Services	\$130,000.00 or 13%
• Planning & Administration	<u>\$170,000.00 or 17%</u>
Total	\$1,000,000.00

This funding budget is based on an estimated amount, as the City has not received the official award funding agreement from the Federal government. The City of Rome has been advised by HUD to continue the 2026 Annual Action Plan process without the allocation agreement. When awarded, the City of Rome will increase or decrease the project level budgeted amounts by an equal percentage based upon any changes before signing the allocation agreement.

This year’s allocation will continue to help develop and improve the CDBG Target Area and urbanized areas. The CDBG Target Area is derived from responses to the most recent Census or American Communities Survey. This funding also allows the City to leverage other funding sources from local, state, and federal programs and resources to provide a more substantial impact in the community.

The spending plan includes Real Property Improvement funding to support the City’s Real Property Program in reducing and eliminating slums and blight through selective site clearance activities. Public

facility funding will focus on pedestrian areas through American with Disabilities Act (ADA) targeted improvements to sidewalks, parks, and other eligible facilities. Public Service funding will support local non-profits with operating expenses who support Rome residents. Economic Development funds will allow the City to support the continuation of the Commercial Façade Improvement Program and business intervention grants to support job creation and retention.

ORDINANCE NO. 9870

**AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,000,000 BONDS OF THE
CITY OF ROME, ONEIDA COUNTY, NEW YORK, TO PAY THE
COST OF LEAD SERVICE LINE INVENTORY.**

WHEREAS, all conditions precedent to the financing of the capital project hereinafter described, including compliance with the provisions of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, have been performed, now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the total voting strength of the Common Council of the City of Rome, Oneida County, New York, as follows:

Section 1. The City of Rome, Oneida County, New York (the "City") intends to undertake a lead service line replacement program including, but not limited to inventory, design, and replacement of lead service lines within the City's established water system (the "LSL Replacement Program") as described in Local Finance Law Section 11(a)(109). In connection with the LSL Replacement Program, the City is hereby authorized to undertake a lead service line inventory, at an estimated maximum cost of \$1,000,000 and to issue an aggregate \$1,000,000 in serial bonds pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law to finance the estimated costs of the aforesaid class of objects or purposes.

Section 2. It is hereby determined that the maximum estimated cost of the aforesaid class of objects or purposes is \$1,000,000, said amount is hereby appropriated therefor and the plan for the financing thereof shall consist of the issuance of \$1,000,000 in serial bonds (the "Bonds") of the City authorized to be issued pursuant to this Ordinance; **PROVIDED, HOWEVER**, any federal or state grant funds received by the City for such objects or purposes shall be applied to pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds or any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the Bonds or, to the extent obligations have not been issued under this Ordinance, to reduce the maximum principal amount of Bonds to be issued.

Section 3. It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid class of objects or purposes is thirty (30) years pursuant to paragraph 109 of Section 11.00(a) of the Local Finance Law.

Section 4. Pursuant to Section 107.00(d)(9) of the Local Finance Law, current funds are not required to be provided prior to issuance of the Bonds or any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of issuance of the Bonds.

Section 5. The temporary use of available funds of the City, not immediately required for the purpose or purposes for which the same were borrowed, raised or otherwise

created, is hereby authorized pursuant to Section 165.10 of the Local Finance Law, for the capital purposes described in Section 1 of this Ordinance.

Section 6. The Bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the Bonds, shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and the Bonds, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the Bonds, shall be general obligations of the City, payable as to both principal and interest by a general tax upon all the real property within the City without legal or constitutional limitation as to rate or amount. The faith and credit of the City are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the Bonds, and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the City by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the Bonds and bond anticipation notes to mature in such year, and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 7. Subject to the provisions of this Ordinance and of the Local Finance Law, and pursuant to the provisions of Sections 21.00, 30.00, 50.00 and 56.00 to 63.00, inclusive, of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the Bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, and the power to prescribe the terms, form and contents of the Bonds, and any bond anticipation notes, and the power to sell and deliver the Bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of the Bonds, and the power to issue bonds providing for level or substantially level or declining annual debt service, is hereby delegated to the City Treasurer, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the City.

Section 8. This Ordinance is intended to constitute the declaration of the City's "official intent" to reimburse the expenditures authorized by this Ordinance with the proceeds of the Bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized herein, as required by Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

Section 9. The serial bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized to be issued by this Ordinance are hereby authorized to be consolidated, at the option of the City's Treasurer, the Chief Fiscal Officer, with the serial bonds and bond anticipation notes authorized by other Bond Ordinances previously or hereafter adopted by the Common Council for purposes of sale into one or more bond or note issues aggregating an amount not to exceed the amount authorized in such ordinances. All matters regarding the sale of the bonds, including the date of the bonds, the use of electronic bidding, the consolidation of the serial bonds and the bond anticipation notes with other issues of the City and the serial maturities of the bonds are hereby delegated to the City Treasurer, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the City.

Section 10. The validity of the Bonds authorized by this Ordinance and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the Bonds may be contested only if:

(a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the City is not authorized to expend money; or

(b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of this Ordinance or a summary hereof are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty (20) days after the date of such publication; or

(c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 11. This Ordinance, or a summary of this Ordinance, shall be published in the official newspapers of the City for such purpose, together with a notice of the Clerk of the City in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 12. The City Treasurer, as Chief Fiscal Officer of the City, is hereby authorized to enter into an undertaking for the benefit of the holders of the Bonds from time to time, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of the Bonds, requiring the City to provide secondary market disclosure as required by Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12.

Section 13. In the absence of the City Treasurer, the Deputy Treasurer of the City is hereby specifically authorized to exercise the powers delegated to the City Treasurer in this Resolution.

Section 14. This Ordinance is not subject to a mandatory or permissive referendum.

Section 15. The Council hereby determines that the provisions of the State Environmental Quality Review Act and the regulations thereunder have previously been satisfied with respect to the expenditures authorized by this Ordinance.

Section 16. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

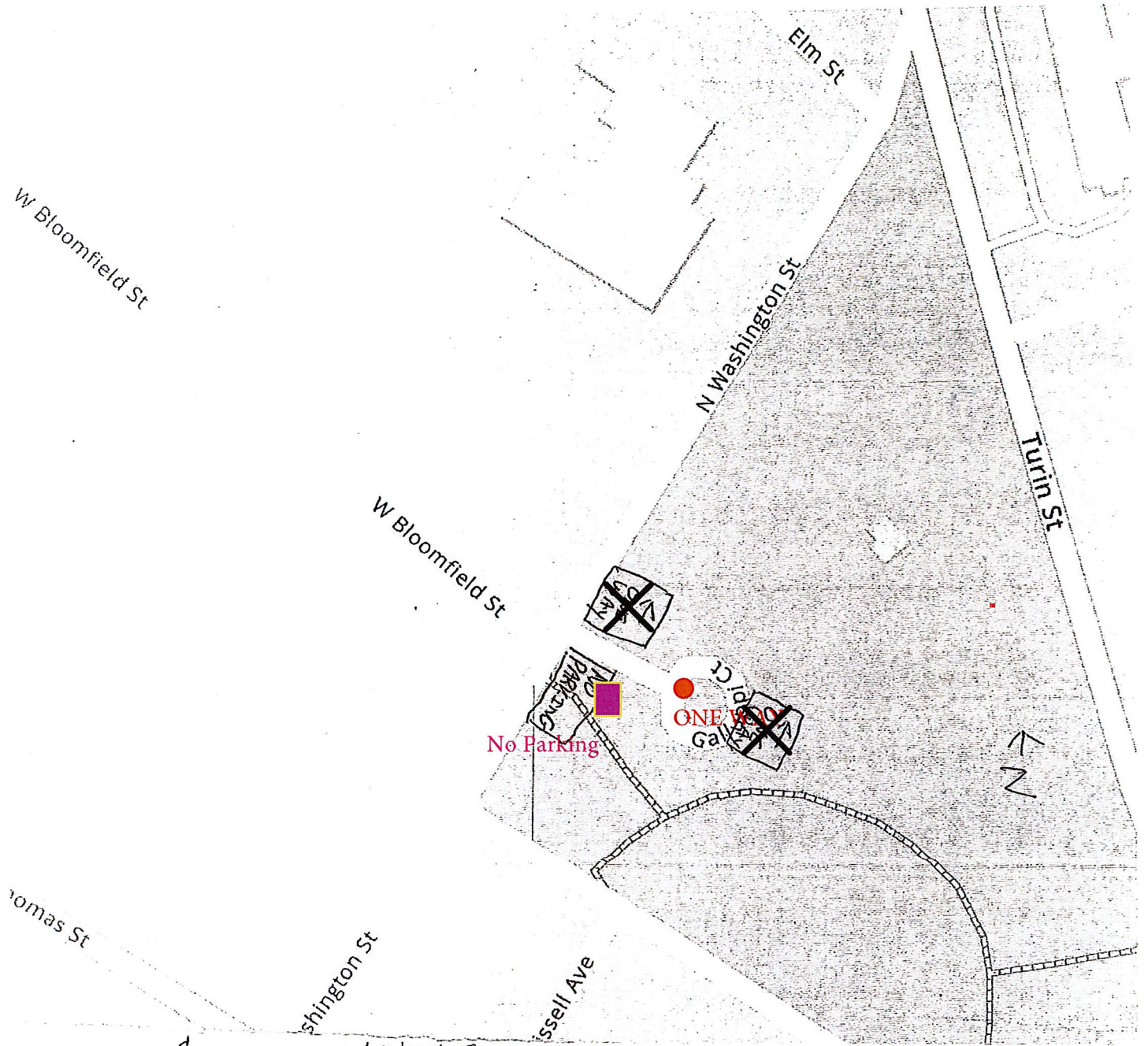

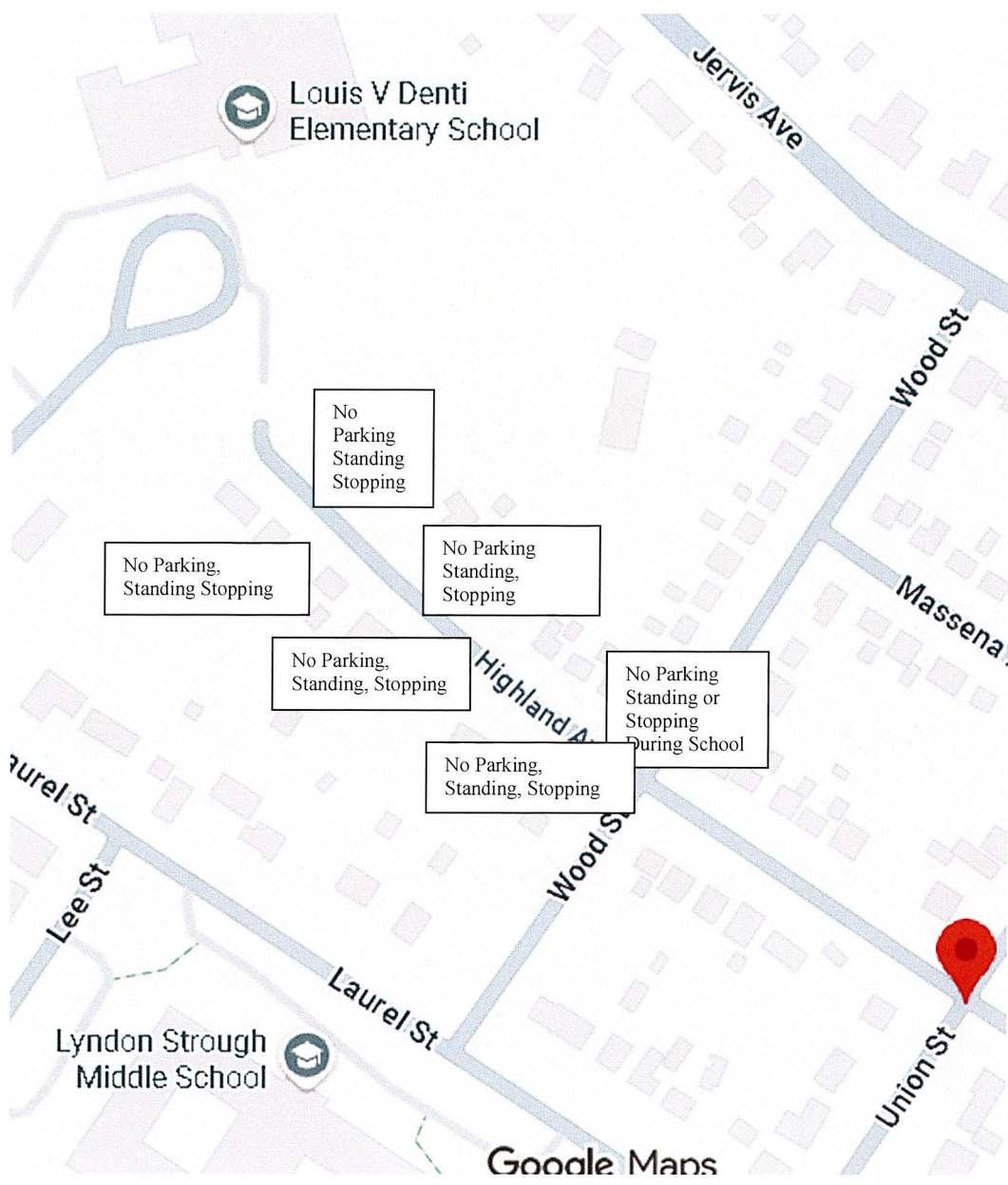
